HORSERADISH

Nothing beats prime rib with prepared horseradish! Horseradish is a large, weedy looking perennial grown for it's coarse white roots. Simply peel the root, grate and mix with vinegar or cream to make a condiment that will take your breath away! The roots are easy to plant and do best in rich moist soils. Dig a small hole or shallow trench in a sunny out of the way spot, about 4-6" deep as soon as the soil can be worked in the spring. Lay the root flat in the hole or trench and cover with a couple inches of soil. As the plant grows, pull soil in around the growing shoots until the hole or trench is mounded 4 or 5". Horseradish will spread, so give it at least 12" of space between it and another horseradish root or another plant. Harvest roots from late fall after a hard frost until spring. Leave small roots in the ground for next years crop. The harvest will improve each year, usually starting the second year after planting.
