Pruning your Clematis

Type 1 – Not applicable for the varieties at Landon’s Greenhouse for 2015 growing season.

Type 2 – The first year all stems should be cut back to one foot tall in early spring. In the spring of the second year, cut back all stems to three feet tall. For the third and subsequent years, cut back all stems to a strong pair of buds in early spring and tie stems onto their support.

Type 3 – In the early spring of the first year cut back stems to one foot tall (or close to ground level in severe climates). In the second and subsequent years, reduce all stems to just above the base of the previous season’s growth above soil level (or near ground level in severe climates).
